<p><b>1. Visual Display &amp; supporting graphs, drawings, diagrams</b></p> <p>Are all required components on display: Display board, Log Book, Written Report</p> <p>Does the display explain the project well?</p> <p>Are the supporting graphs, drawings, etc. neat and easy to understand?</p> <p>Is the question or problem clearly shown, and the student's hypothesis?</p> <p>Are tools, objects, notes, etc. from the project on display?</p>	<p><b>Score from 1 to 10</b></p>
<p><b>2. Oral Explanation</b></p> <p>Does the student show comprehension of the project? Does the explanation demonstrate critical thinking?</p>	
<p><b>3. Written Report</b></p> <p><i>(The written report should explain what was done in the project.)</i></p> <p>Is it well written?</p> <p>Is it well organized? Is it neat?</p> <p>Does it show accurate spelling and good grammar?</p>	<p><b>Score from 1 to 10</b></p>
<p><b>4. Overall Project</b></p> <p><i>(This element looks at the effectiveness of the project as an integrated whole.)</i></p> <p>Was the topic well chosen? Is it interesting?</p> <p>Is the presentation attractive?</p> <p>A photograph of the student working on the project is a bonus.</p>
